# SIVA PARVATHAMMA

## Devoted Hindu Woman Set Free by the Gospel of Jesus

She's a 51-year-old woman, deeply spiritual and devoted to the Hindu god Krishna. In her eyes, she wasn't just a follower, she saw herself as chosen, reborn to serve others and live a life of spiritual sacrifice.

But behind her devotion was deep pain and confusion. Locals told us she would go alone to the temple at midnight and sit for hours.

She would speak to herself, sometimes smiling, sometimes weeping, as though caught in conversation with unseen spirits. Other times, she would lock herself inside her home for days, believing she was a goddess. Her behavior was unpredictable, and many in the community feared her or simply avoided her.



# BUT WE SAW SOMETHING DIFFERENT.

When we met her, we didn't see a woman to be pitied—we saw a soul longing for peace. A heart desperate for truth. A person searching for love that never fades.

As we shared the Gospel with her, something began to shift. Her body trembled. Her eyes welled up with tears. She listened closely as we told her about a God who doesn't demand rituals to earn love, but who gave His life out of love for her. We spoke about Jesus—the Son of God—who came not to control us, but to set us free.

And right there, something incredible happened.

The demonic spirit that had held her in spiritual bondage for years left her. In the name of Jesus, the lies were broken. The confusion lifted. For the first time in decades, she felt peace—not a temporary calm from meditation or ritual, but a deep, soul-restoring peace that only comes from knowing Jesus Christ.

She cried—not in fear, but in freedom. She gave her life to Jesus. And in that moment, she was made new.

Today, she's a different woman. Her face is calmer. Her words are clearer. The chaos is gone. She's started reading the Bible and is walking a new path—one filled with hope, purpose, and truth. She's no longer wandering in the dark. She's been found by the Light.

This is why we do what we do. Not for fame. Not for numbers. But for one soul at a time, because every soul matters to God.

We are just His servants, but He is the Healer. The Savior. The One who still casts out demons, breaks chains, and brings people back to life—spiritually, emotionally, and eternally.

# A YOUNG WIDOW'S FIGHT FOR LIFE, LOVE, AND HER BABY

She's just 21 years old—but life has already buried her dreams, her health, and her joy under a mountain of sorrow.

When we met mrudhula, she was sitting outside a small, crumbling home in a rural village called Pedavadlapudi, rocking her 1.5-year-old baby boy in her lap. Her frame was frail, her breathing heavy, and her eyes told a story far older than her years. A beautiful young woman... but broken, coughing, and fading.

Mrudula has tuberculosis, But her diagnosis is only a chapter in a much longer story—a story that began when she was just a child herself.



Her marriage was filled with pressure and pain. Her husband wanted children, and when she didn't conceive quickly, he blamed and mistreated her. She finally gave birth to a baby boy—but soon after, her husband died in a tragic accident, leaving her alone.

Now, with a 1.5-year-old son, Mrudula is battling severe TB, poverty, and rejection from her in-laws.

Weak and underweight, she was struggling to breathe, struggling to eat, and struggling to survive—yet her only words to us were:

**“I just want to see my son grow up. I want to be his mother, not his memory.”**

That broke our hearts. We stepped in with immediate support:

- **Nutritious food for Mrudula and her baby**
- **Financial Aid to restart her TB treatment**
- **Emotional Counselling and rest care**

For as long as anyone can remember, she's lived on the edges of society—invisible to most, feared by many. She doesn't have a family to care for her. She doesn't have a diagnosis. She doesn't have anything, really—except an abandoned concrete shell of a house where she lays her head at night.

Inside that crumbling shelter, it's dark, damp, and scattered with broken bricks, garbage, ashes—and yes, even venomous snakes.

But Jesus doesn't wait for people to be safe or clean or sane before He calls them worthy.



## MONTHLY ACTIVITY REPORT

When we first met Jyothi, she was curled up in a corner, talking softly to herself. Her hair was thickly matted, her arms covered in bruises and insect bites. She wasn't aggressive—just lost. Deeply lost. She didn't know how to respond when we offered her food. She didn't ask who we were. She just stared. We sat with her anyway. Not to fix her. Not to convert her. Just to be there.

We placed a clean blanket over her shoulders. We handed her a bottle of clean water and a warm meal. We whispered quiet prayers. We didn't say anything fancy. We just said her name out loud—because when the world treats you like a ghost, sometimes the first healing is simply being seen.

Jyothi still doesn't speak much. But last week, when we handed her a packet of rice and gently said, "Hi Rekha, we're here again,"—she smiled.

And for a woman who's lived most of her life unseen and untouched, that smile meant everything.

### **What Jyothi Needs Now:**

Jyothi's needs are simple, but not small:

- A safe, clean place to live
- Access to basic mental health care and daily supervision
- Ongoing nutrition and hygiene support
- And most of all—consistent human presence. Someone to remind her, over and over again, that she's not forgotten.

Because Jyothi is not a lost cause. She's a person. Made in the image of God.

And while the world may turn its back on her, we believe she's worth every step, every meal, every prayer.
